## Complete in Christ



In Colossians 2:10, Paul assures us that we are complete in Christ. The Greek word translated *complete* brings out the idea of sufficiency and abundance—being furnished or supplied liberally so as to "fill to the brim," so that nothing is lacking. This brings to mind the beautiful words of David recorded in Psalm 23:5: "My cup runneth over." The word can also mean "to fulfill; carry out, or to carry something through to the end."

In Colossians 2:9, we read that "In Him [Christ] dwells all the fullness of the Godhead [the state of being God; Deity] bodily." The word fullness here means "that of which a thing is full" (Vines), that is—wholly filled to perfect completion. "For it pleased the Father that in Him should all fulness dwell" (Colossians 1:19). Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God, is filled to perfect completion with the presence, person, power and possessions of God. And those who have been baptized into Christ for the remission of their sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16), have "put on," or "clothed themselves" with Christ (Galatians 3:27). So, we are complete in Him because we are *in* the One who is fully complete!

And He is *in* <u>us</u> as well. Those in Christ can assuredly affirm, along with the Apostle Paul, "I [*put your name here*] have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). This is "Christ *in* <u>you</u>, the hope of glory!" (Colossians 1:17).

everything else we need as well (Matthew 6:33; Philippians 4:19). So, if you are in Christ, you are complete in Him. Christ is all you need!

We can confidently echo the sentiments expressed by the Psalmist in Psalm 73:25-26, "Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire (lit., "delight or take pleasure in") besides You. My flesh [body] and my heart [mind] fail; But God is the strength (lit., "rock") of my heart and my portion (lit., "possession") forever." In other words, Christ is all I'll ever need. Amen!


