Never Say "Never!"

On the night He was betrayed by Judas and handed over to the hate-filled, envious Jewish

leaders, the Lord said to His disciples: "All of you will be made to stumble because of Me this night." Then the beloved Apostle Peter, whom we love for his brash impulsive nature, answered: "Even if all are made to stumble because of You, I will never be made to stumble ... even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You!" (Mt 26:31-35). But Peter did deny the Lord. He denied Him three times as the Lord had accurately predicted he would (vv. 58-75).

Hence the sobering warning given to us in Scripture: "Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall" (1 Cor 10:12). The word "stand" in the Greek can mean "to continue safe and sound." This warning is applicable to all of us in those times when we are lulled into thinking we are "all set" and are somehow immune to temptation or incapable of falling away. WARNING! This kind of complacent overconfidence can quickly lead to one's downfall!

Whenever we are beginning to rest secure in our own strength and skills—feeling "spiritually smug" perhaps—we had better "take heed!" The Greek here brings out the idea of "seeing with the mind's eye to carefully consider, contemplate, examine and weigh carefully." In other words, we are to take a good, hard look at ourselves. Or, as 2 Corinthians 13:5 admonishes, "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves." Wise counsel indeed! The Bible and history are filled with sorrowful accounts of those who neglected to regularly undergo or submit to this kind of spiritual examination.

A broken-hearted Paul wrote: "Demas has forsaken me, having loved this present world" (2 Tim 4:10). We need to be acutely aware that there are aspects of this sinful world that are pleasurable, alluring and tempting. But these things are temporary and fleeting and can never satisfy the deep needs of the soul. This is why the Lord asks the penetrating and

probing questions: "For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?" (Mt 16:26). These exemplify the types of excellent questions with which one can effectively "examine himself" on a regular basis.

If we fail to "take heed", we may be heading for a fearsome formidable "fall." This word means "to be thrust down, to fall from a state of uprightness, to fail, to fall under judgement or condemnation." Powerful word! And one that should really get our attention. No one believes it can happen to them. Peter certainly didn't! But it does happen. It happens all too often. It can happen to you. So, never say "never!" — Terry Schmidt &
