Follow My Example

The Apostle Paul dispenses wise counsel in 1 Corinthians 11:1 when he says: "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ." And again, in Philippians 3:17 he admonishes: "Brethren, join in following my example, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern." The Greek word translated "pattern" here is "typos" from where we get our English word "type." And, in this context, it refers to "an example to be imitated—of those worthy of imitation." We are to "note" ["mark" – KJV] those who are setting a good godly example and imitate their manner, conduct and behavior. The Greek word translated "note" literally means "to take aim at." It includes the idea of directing one's attention to someone, fixing one's eves upon them to observe, contemplate, and then take heed to thyself [apply what is learned to one's life].

Depending on where we are at certain stages in our lives, it may be difficult to find those whom we might deem "worthy of imitation." But we can always turn to the pages of our Bibles and learn from those "heroes of faith" recorded in Scripture. Such a man is Caleb. Caleb was a servant of God who lived a righteous life in faithful obedience to God's will. He is definitely worthy of imitation. Throughout his entire life, this man of God developed and maintained an unshakable, enduring faith. Without exception, as it concerned his walk with God, he remained "steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord" (1 Cor 15:58). The question you & I may ask is, "How did he do it?"

The Lord Himself will help answer the question for us. In Deuteronomy 1:35-36, the Lord declares: "Surely not one of these men of this evil generation shall see that good land of which I swore to give to your fathers, <u>except Caleb</u> the son of Jephunneh; he shall see it, and to him and his children I am giving the land on which he walked, <u>because he wholly followed the LORD</u>." The bottom line is—boiling everything down to its very essence—Caleb wholeheartedly obeyed the *first* and *greatest* commandment cited by the Lord Jesus in Mark 12:30. "And you shall love the Lord your God with <u>all</u> your heart, with <u>all</u> your soul, with <u>all</u> your mind, and with <u>all</u> your strength."

Because Caleb loved the Lord with this level of intensity—with every inch and ounce of his being—his allegiance to God was strong, stable and secure. And, as a loyal servant, he put God and His will first in everything (Mt 6:33). Because Caleb's love *for* God and his allegiance *to* God was paramount—the highest priority in his life—obedience to God's commandments and the following of His will were inevitable and nonnegotiable. "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not burdensome" (1 Jn 5:3).

Caleb truly had a heart for God, and this wholesome attitude manifested itself in a lifetime of faithful, obedient service to God and His people. May the same be able to be said of us when it's our time to depart this life and step into eternity. And, on that great Day, may we hear those exciting words from our Lord & Savior Jesus Christ: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy Lord!"
