New Beginnings



Years ago, when we were kids, playing games or engaged in some other childhood activity, we would often employ the use of a "do over." This offered us a chance to correct a mistake or improve our performance from an earlier attempt. The nineteenth century preacher and writer Alexander Whyte once wrote: "The victorious Christian life is a series of new beginnings." In other words—a do over! And we can be thankful that we serve a God of second chances.

Our loving Father is definitely in the business of salvaging broken lives and restoring lost souls. "Through the Lords' mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not" (Lamentations 3:22). "For when we were still without strength (completely powerless, helpless, hopeless), in due time Christ died for the ungodly...God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8). Now, "in Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" (Ephesians 1:7). "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

Our new beginning started when we "obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which [we] were delivered" (Romans 6:17). At that time, we "purified our souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit...having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever" (1 Peter 1:22-23). Having been "baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38), we were "born again" (John 3:3-8), raised to "walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4), becoming "a new creation" in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Even as Christians, our "do overs" continue to be necessary—because we still sin. "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8). But our God of second

chances has ensured our new beginning with the truth of these words: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

With God's help and by His grace (lovingly extended to us through Jesus Christ His Son), we can always begin anew. Like the Psalmist, you and I can confidently and joyfully exclaim, "Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered" (Psalm 32:1). And again, "He restores my soul!" (Psalm 23:3). To which we could add... Amen! — Terry Schmidt &
