Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a federal holiday dedicated to honor our veterans of all wars. However, according to the



Department of Veterans Affairs, most Americans confuse this holiday with Memorial Day. Memorial Day honors service members who *died* in service to their country, or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day, but the difference is that Veterans Day is set aside to thank and honor *living* veterans who served honorably in the military, whether in wartime or peacetime.

The history of this holiday is rather interesting. It was originally observed as a legal holiday to honor the end of World War I. In 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice – a temporary cessation of hostilities – was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in what was then known as "the Great War," or "the War to End All Wars." One year later, in November 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11th as the first commemoration of Armistice Day. The day's observation included parades and public gatherings, as well as a brief pause in business and school activities at 11 a.m. Armistice Day would later become a federal holiday in 1938.

In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day. Due to the lobbying efforts of service members who had fought in World War II and in the Korean War, Congress amended the 1938 act, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of the word "Veterans." President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the legislation on June 1, 1954.

From then on, November 11th has been known as Veterans Day -a day to honor the veterans of all wars. President Eisenhower also created a Veterans Day National Committee which ensures, even to this day, that our veterans are properly recognized each year. Over the years, Veterans Day has evolved into a day not just for remembering those who served in wartime but also for recognizing all veterans, including those who served in peacetime.

It now serves as a time to reflect on veterans' contributions, as well as their ongoing challenges as they serve our country. The day has become a platform for honoring their service, while also advocating for veterans' needs.

The history of Veterans Day is closely tied to our nation's history and gives Americans an opportunity to honor the service of those who have made sacrifices to protect us and secure our way of life. Veterans Day is a profound reminder of the duty, honor, and sacrifice that are the hallmarks of military service. By continuing to observe this day each year, Americans reaffirm their respect for these values and recognize the immense contributions of their military service members. Parades and other ceremonies held on this holiday serve to remember & honor the service and sacrifices of veterans, providing opportunities for solemn reflection.
