Thanksgiving Day

The first Thanksgiving was quite different from the one we celebrate in our day. After enduring many hardships—an extremely harsh winter, including much sickness and the deaths of about half the settlers—the Pilgrims were blessed the following year with a plentiful harvest. Because of this bounty, Governor William Bradford arranged a harvest festival to be held on December 13, 1621.

The primary purpose of the feast was to give thanks to God for blessings received. The festival lasted 3 days and included not only an abundance of food, but even games and a military review. Although this festival was very different from our Thanksgiving Day, we as a nation still observe it for the same reason—to give thanks to God for blessings we have received from His loving hand.

Beginning with George Washington, observance of a national day of thanksgiving had been mandated by individual presidential proclamations until 1941 when Congress decreed the fourth Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day, making it a federal holiday.

In his proclamation that year, President Franklin D. Roosevelt called it "a day to be observed in giving thanks to the Heavenly Source of our earthly blessings. On the day appointed for this purpose, let us reflect at our homes or places of worship on the goodness of God and in giving thanks."

Worthy sentiments, to be sure! But, if we're not careful, this wonderful holiday can become so filled with activity and the fellowship of family and friends, that we may forget to observe the great and noble purpose for which it was intended.

In Psalm 116:12, the Psalmist asks a profound question: "What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits toward me?" Realizing all the many blessings we receive from the gracious hand of our loving Father, this would be an appropriate question for us to ponder.

The Psalmist's answer comes in verse 17: "I will offer to Thee the sacrifice of thanksgiving, and I will call upon the name of the Lord." This year, as we observe this cherished holiday, let's be sure to take time to express our heartfelt thanks to God and show our sincere gratitude to Him by sharing some of what we have with others.
