## Why Are You Doing This to Me?

Our gracious God is often unfairly criticized and unjustly vilified. How well I remember the time when a co-worker's wife drove to the shop in a car that sounded like it was ready for the junkyard. After her husband looked the car over, it was found that there were major problems with the automatic transmission. The car was undrivable and this would be an expensive repair. Having received the bad news, and her day basically ruined, the lady raised her fist to heaven and shook it angrily yelling, "Why are you doing this to me?" Like many people, she was blaming God for her problems.

God gets blamed for many things. Hurricanes, tornados, earthquakes and floods are usually referred to as "acts of God" - especially by insurance companies. Blaming God for our problems seems to be a part of human nature. As the inspired Scripture says: "A man's own folly ruins his life, yet his heart rages against the Lord" (Proverbs 19:3). This goes all the way back to the beginning – to the very first sin in the garden of Eden. When questioned by God about his part in this, Adam replied: "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree and I ate" (Genesis 3:12). The gist of this seems to be: "Yes, I did wrong ... but God, it's really Your fault!" Our heavenly Father is not some "cosmic killjoy" looking to make our lives miserable. The truth is, God is good. He is even kind to the unthankful and evil (Luke 6:35). "He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45).

This is why David praises Him and exalts His name. "Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name! Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits: Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases, Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies, Who satisfies your mouth with good things, so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.... The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in mercy. He will not always strive with us, nor will He keep His anger forever. He has not dealt with us according to our sins, nor punished us according to our iniquities. For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is His mercy toward those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us. As a father pities [has compassion on] his children, so the Lord pities [shows compassion on] those who fear Him. For He knows our frame; He remembers that we are dust" (Psalm 103:1-5; 8-14).

At this point, we should join the Apostle Paul in exclaiming: "What shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" (Romans 8:31-32). Rather than blame God, we would do well to follow the good example of Job who, having just lost all his children and earthly possessions, fell to the ground and worshiped, blessed the name of the Lord, and refused to charge God with wrongdoing (Job 1). Here, the wisdom of the wise old sage Sirach is fitting: "Do not blame the Lord for your sin; the Lord does not cause that which he hates."
